# MAY DAY 2017

May Day 2017 continues the legacy of generations of workers, students and activists in fighting for a better future. May Day is celebrated around the world and is recognised as international workers day. The working class comes together globally to celebrate the campaigns and achievements of unions and community groups fighting for equality, democracy and justice through solidarity and action.

May Day 2017 is being celebrated in Sydney on Sunday May 7 with speeches kicking off at Hyde Park North from 12 midday. We will then be marching together to Prince Alfred Park where there will be live music, food and entertainment, with activities and rides planned for all ages. May Day 2017 will be a day for the community to come together and a day for the whole family to enjoy.

The theme for May Day 2017 is fighting inequality.

Under neoliberal governments we have seen the gap between the rich and the poor widen; the unequal distribution of wealth created by workers is impacting terribly on the elderly, the unemployed, and students, and is extending onto workers with cuts to penalty rates for 700,000 workers losing up to \$6,000 a year, the loss of decent secure employment, the soaring cost of living, the privatisation of essential services that many Australians depend on and the introduction of the ABCC.

**With so much at stake for workers, students, the elderly and our communities, we must use the opportunity to come together and fight back for a better future.**

**Let's make this year's May Day the biggest we've ever seen in the history of our movement to show Governments that the workers' united will never be defeated.**
