SECTION 82 (1) DETERMINATION NO. 866 OF 1987

Departmental Professional Officers

(1) INTRODUCTORY

The Board has, following discussions with the N.S.W. Public Service Professional Officers Association and the Fublic Service Association of New South Wales, determined, pursuant to Section 82 (1) of the Fublic Service Act, 1979, a classification of Departmental Professional Officer with salaries as prescribed herein.

(2) DEFINITIONS

"Officer" means and includes all persons permanently or temporarily employed under the Public Service Act, 1979, and who are appointed to a position

Departmental Professional Officer' means an officer who has a degree of a recognised University requiring a minimum of three years full-time study or an officer deemed by the Board to hold equivalent qualifications.

(3) SALARIES

Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1979, and the Regulation thereunder, the salaries to be paid to officers appointed to positions covered by this Determination are those specified herein, provided that an officer temporarily employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1979, shall unless otherwise determined by the Board, be paid the weekly equivalent of the appual salary prescribed.

(4) INCREMENTS

- (a) The payment of increments under the scale of salaties prescribed by this Determination shall be subject to approval by the Board.
- (b) One month prior to the date on which an officer will become eligible for an increment of salary, the Department Head shall report to the Board as to conduct and the manner in which the daties of the officer have been performed.
- (c) In cases where the recommendation of the Department Head is adverse to the granting of an increment, and such recommendation has been approved by the Board, the officer affected shall have the right of appeal to the Board.

(5) CALCULATION OF SERVICE

In calculating years of service for the purpose of this Determination, the following periods shall not be taken into account:

- (a) any period in respect of which an increment is refused under Clause (4) hereof;
- (b) any leave of absence without pay exceeding five days in any incremental year,
- (c) any period necessary to give full effect to a reduction in salary imposed by the Board by virtue of Section 94, 95 or 133 of the Fublic Service Act, 1979.

(6) WAGE BASE

The salaries prescribed in Clause (3) SALARIES of this Determination are based on a basic wage for adult males of \$115.40 per week.

Such salaries shall be varied from time to time following any determination of the Industrial Commission of New South Wales made pursuant to Section 57 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1940, in like manner as if this Determination were an Award prescribing annual rates of salaries to which the provisions of that Act apply, provided that the salaries as so varied shall be adjusted to the nearest dollar.

DATE OF EFFECT

This Determination shall take effect from 15 October, 1987.

It shall apply to all officers who on the offective date of the Determination, were occupying a position covered by this Determination, or who, after that date, are appointed to one of such positions.
