

Economic vandalism – PSA rebukes job cuts

The PSA has publicly rebuked the Department of Premier and Cabinet's (DPC) planned job cuts.

In *The Sydney Morning Herald* this morning, PSA General Secretary Stewart Little stated:

“Voluntary or not, the redundancies were still job losses ... These roles won't be replaced and it will leave NSW with fewer jobs overall. This government awards \$5 million in contracts to outsource its policy plans to big four consultants, and then cuts jobs – all in the name of efficiency. That's not efficiency, it is economic vandalism.”
