

THE TRUTH ABOUT INSECURE JOBS

Since 2011 when the NSW Coalition government came to power, too many NSW state government employees have been employed in insecure jobs, such as:

- short-term contracts
- casual roles
- temporary agency hire,

For many workers, insecure work means experiencing an uncertain financial future. Financial institutions are reluctant to deal with people in insecure work, leaving many struggling to obtain home loans and other financial services.

As they are easier to dismiss, people in insecure employment are more vulnerable at work. They are less likely to ask for a pay rise or better conditions.

With the cost of living on the rise and real wages going down secure work has never been more important.

There are also disadvantages for the government in that insecure work reduces institutional knowledge as employees' contracts expire.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

There are few workers in the country who get to choose who their employer is. However, you will have just this opportunity in March 2023, at the next NSW State Election.

We hope, when you go to vote, that you remember how the NSW State Government has treated its employees these last 12 years and vote accordingly.
