Introduction to the new PSA/CPSU NSW Women's Council Committee

The aim of the WCC is to watch the interests of our unions' women members and to consider any questions which affect them.

WCC represents a range of workplace locations, including workplaces across the Sydney metropolitan, the large regional centres and regional NSW. Also encouraging diversity from a variety of cultural, ages and ethnicity, including women from male-dominated workplaces, as well as those with even gender balance workplace as well as those dominated by women.

All women members of the PSA and CPSU NSW are Women's Councillors and therefore eligible to vote and nominate for WCC. The newly elected members to WCC consist of 20-24 members, with Executive and Central Council women members who are ex-officio to WCC. Those women are elected by financial women members, grouped into 10-12 electorates (dependant on membership numbers) with representation from not less than 350 members.
